VHC Rules and Regulations

No motorized vehicles on the XC course.

All personnel must follow appropriate rules when utilizing a golf cart, to include being licensed to operate a motorized vehicle while on grounds.

Festiva

Trade Fare

There will be a trade fare of local businesses in the coliseum.

Parking

Parking is free!

Trailers must be parked in designated parking areas. NO trailer parking in any location designated with "No Trailer Parking" signage.

Golf Carts

- All drivers must have a valid driver's license
- All drivers must follow posted signage
- Golf Carts are available for rent on-site from VHC (see VHC website, VHC Golf Cart Rental Link)

USEF Motorized Vehicle Statement

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Bicycles

Attendees may ride bicycles on site. Bicycles must:

- Give way to horses
- Be parked at the end of barns for duration of festival

Dogs and Pets

- Are not allowed in the barns or indoor venues
- Must be leashed at all times
- Must never be left unattended

Ice

Bagged ice can be purchased on-site outside of the VHC Stabling Office (see VHC map at the beginning of the program for location)

Equine Travel & Accommodations

Show Services - Veterinarian & Farrier Information

Veterinarian and Farrier are available on site between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm daily. An on-call veterinarian or farrier can be reached after hours if needed. A list of available veterinarians and farriers can be found posted at the stabling office.

Equine Travel Requirements

All equines traveling onto the Virginia Horse Center must have a current, negative coggins. All equines that will be traveling across state lines must also have a Certificate of Veterinary Health (CVI) within 30 days. Coggins and CVI must be valid for the duration of the competition. All equines must have proof of vaccination per discipline requirements.

Loading/Unloading

Participants must unload as quickly as possible in the barn areas. No vehicles are allowed in barns areas except for loading/unloading. All aisles and roadways around barns must be kept open pursuant to fire regulations.

Commercially Shipped Horses

Must have authorized horse-knowledgeable representatives to meet the van on arrival and be able to care for horses until competitors are on the grounds. Plan enough individuals as appropriate for the number of mounts on the van and to be at the barns BEFORE the horses are scheduled to arrive.

Bedding, Hay, and Feed

No bedding, hay, or feed is included with your entry fee. Bedding can be preordered from the VHC Stabling Office. There is no hay or feed sold onsite. There is a local Tractor Supply less than 2 miles from the Virginia Horse Center (800 North Lee Hwy, Lexington, VA 24450) Tractor Supply Lexington VA.

Early Arrival and Layover Stalls

Competitors and Equines may arrival as early as Tuesday, July 15 at 10:00 am. Competitors and Equines must leave grounds no later than 10:00 am on Monday, July 21. Mega-Rally fee includes 4 nights of stabling. Additional nights can be purchased at the Stabling Office \$35 per night.

Stabling Information

Stall Specification - All stalls are 12' x 12' with rubber mats and full doors.

Fans may be used and must have 3 prongs. Please be sure to bring appropriate fan hanging equipment along with appropriate extension cords and material to secure fan cords up and away from horses in the stalls.

Smoking and Vaping are not permitted in or around the barn area.

No drilling or nailing into doors or walls permitted.

Stall Assignments - Stabling Office will have all Stall Assignments.

Stall Stripping - Stalls do not need to be stripped prior to departure (yay)!

Waste Disposal

<u>Manure Disposal</u> – Manure and used shavings removed from stalls and trailers must be placed in the designated bins located on the ends of each barn. Empty shaving bags must be placed in trashcans and NOT in the manure pits.

<u>Medical Waste</u> – Medical waste, to include needles, syringes, and other medical supplies must be discarded in the appropriate sharps containers in each barn. Please do not discard of any medical waste in stalls, manure pits, or trashcans.

Hacking and Longeing

Hacking and schooling of mounts must take place in the designated locations. Hacking locations and information will be posted daily by the respective Secretaries.



Invitational Mega-Rally Entry Details

Governing Rules

All mega rally disciplines will be governed under the United States Pony Club discipline rulebooks, Horse Management Handbook and annual newsletters.

Mega Rally Entries

- Initial entry must be made through Mid-Atlantic Regions Google Form (insert link)
- Once you enter through the Google Form, your RS will be responsible for putting entries into teams. Mixed certifications and mixed levels within the same discipline may be on the same teams.
- Mounted Mega-Rally Competitors \$450
 - Includes 4 nights stabling
 - o Multiple day competition in your core discipline
 - 3 tickets that entitle you to sign up for classes in the following Show Jumping, Hunters, Cross Country Clinic, Dressage Musical Clinic, 4H Open Classes. Please see the Mega Rally Secretary to schedule use of your Tickets. Additional class entries can also be purchased from the discipline Secretaries.
- Eligible for ribboning within the Mega Rally delegation and in the overall YEF competitions as an individual competitor per specific discipline.
- Quiz Mega-Rally Competitors \$225

Mega Rally Details

Eligibility – Mega Rally Specific

- Age
 - Minimum Age you must have been born on or before 1/1/2015
 - o Maximum Age you must have been born no earlier than 1/1/2000.

 - Younger individuals may compete in disciplines/activities outside the Mega Rally.
- You must have completed a Pony Club rally within the last year, an overnight rally is strongly recommended but not required.
- Certification must be a D2 Riding or higher

Horse Management Expectations

All participants will follow the horse care practices outlined by

- The Standards of Proficiency at their certification level
- Current Horse Management Handbook and HM Newsletter
- Current USPC Manual of Horsemanship D and C Manuals
- Direction of any Mega-Rally Staff

Chaperones and Coaches

<u>Chaperones</u> – In addition to the overall chaperone information stated previously in the guidebook, there will be a chaperone of a team member designated to be the point of contact for the team during the duration of the competition.

<u>Coaches</u> – are allowed in all mounted disciplines. They are encouraged for activities involving jumping. All coaches forms must be submitted upon arrival and can be found on the Championships Information page of the Pony Club website. Refer to appropriate coach forms and rulebooks for details about coaching responsibilities and expectations.

Volunteers

All competitors are required to provide a volunteer during the entry process to assist with Mega Rally. We welcome any additional volunteers who may be willing to help and ask that they email Gammon Castellvi at <u>Gammonlee@gmail.com</u>.

Arrival Email

An email detailing competition arrival procedures, stall assignments, and more time sensitive information will go out to the email submitted upon entry. This email will go out no later than the Monday, July 14, 2025.

Arrival Dates

Horses may arrive as early as Tuesday, July 15 at 10:00 am. Wednesday, July 16 additionally allows for another day of arrivals prior to the start of competition.

Attire

Appropriate to the discipline. People in the stables maybe casual with a focus on appropriateness.

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Disciplines Offered for Mega Rally Teams

In addition to entering the Mega Rally. Competitors may enter individually in other discipline classes of their choice.

<u>Team Configuration</u> – teams will be composed of 3-4 riders and a Stable Manager (non-riding). Please provide your team make-up at to the Mega Rally Office.

Dressage

Mega Rally competitors may choose to do a 4 ride competition (no musicals) in the USEF licensed dressage show running Friday and Saturday OR do the schooling dressage show, also 4 rides, running on Thursday and Sunday. Classes will be offered from Training level thru Second Level USDF 2023 tests. Teams may be of mixed levels and ages. Eventing

This will be a USEA sanctioned horse trial, offering Starter through Training level divisions. This will run Thursday and Friday. ALL competitors, please ensure you choose the correct stabling option for the Mega Rally. Mega Rally teams may be scrambled across the levels and across ages. Riders may be on both a mega rally team and an Interscholastic eventing team as these competitions will be awarded separately.

Show Jumping

The mega rally will include entry into classes 201-205. Class 201-204 will be used for team scoring. Competitors may enter individually in other discipline classes of their choice. See Open Show prize list for class descriptions. Four Clear Rounds' Ribbons – clear round ribbons awarded to all riders who complete four clear rounds in mega-rally divisions

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Awards Ceremony

Team Overall and HM ribbons will be awarded at the Awards Ceremony. Discipline awards will be held at the end of each respective discipline. Please look for a specific time during competition.

Individual Ribbons will be awarded by the discipline.
